Things remain chaotic at Shire Hall, with a Reform administration that likes to make the headlines for all the wrong reasons...

So far the only thing they have delivered is a change in the council's flag policy that only seeks to water down support for minority groups.

They've also failed to turn up to key committees. I sit on the Adult Social Care & Health scrutiny committee, which should have four Reform representatives, however two posts are still vacant, while another has yet to attend!

In the midst of this chaos, Liberal Democrat colleagues and I are pushing for real change:

- **Action on Highways** - Pushing for better priority setting that responds to local need, not big vanity projects.
- **Social Care & Health** - Integrating social care and health services with effective use of data.
- **Electric Vehicle Transition** - Backing more ambitious targets to install and support more EV charging points in our town.
- **Supporting Active Travel** - Promoting cycling and walking to take cars off the roads, reduce traffic and deliver better health outcomes.

## NEW LOOK FOR WARWICKSHIRE

**On October 14<sup>th</sup>, Reform, Labour and Conservative County Councillors united to vote to reorganise Warwickshire into a 'super council'.**

This will see the abolition of our district and county council, to be replaced by a new 'Warwickshire Council' which will carry out all local government services. This is intended to simplify local government for residents and enable greater integration of services.

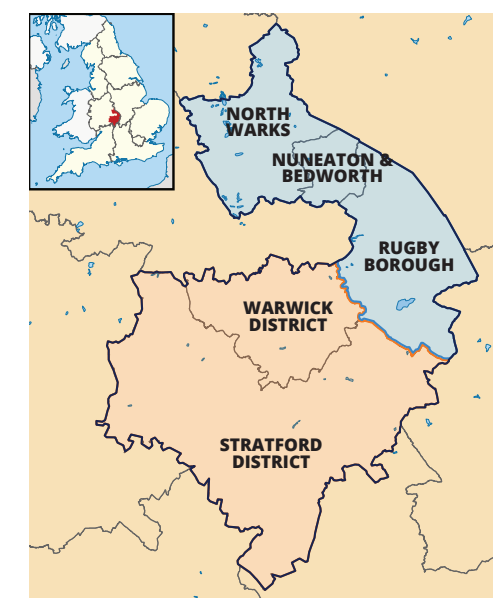
However, by combining these services we will see the removal of local decision-making, with all decisions being made in an unwieldy 114

councillor chamber.

It will also mean that our local council tax will go up, to match the high council tax rates in the north of the county. This will see an additional £78.85 (3.6%) added onto our tax bills, on top of a likely annual 5% increase.

Instead, I voted in favour of a new South Warwickshire, which would have kept decision-making local and our council tax lower.

The final decision will sit with the Labour Minister in Westminster and we should hear back in the middle of next year.

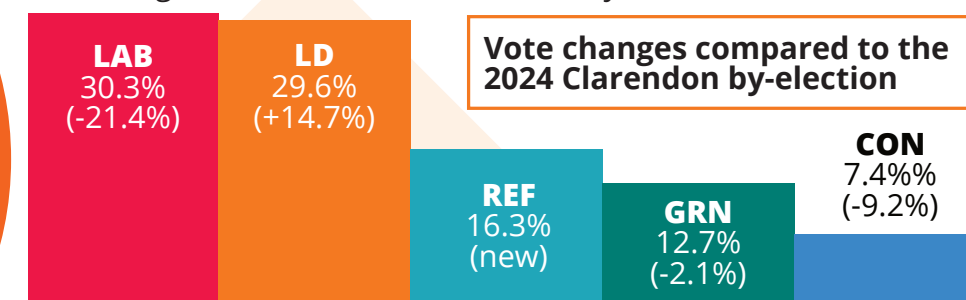
## THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT!

Under the plan, the typical household bill would fall from £1,720 to around £850.

"Far too many people are struggling to make ends meet as prices go up and up. Only the Liberal Democrats have a plan that will make a real difference to people's finances."

The Lib Dem plan would break the link between gas and electricity prices, letting people benefit from clean, low-cost power. It would also speed up investment in renewables and insulation to bring bills down even more.
